December 7, 1941



**Ewa Plain Battlefield (Ewa Mooring Mast Field) was officially listed in the National Register of Historic Places on May 23, 2016.**

The Battle of Ewa Plain began just before 8 AM and was part of the larger surprise attack by the Imperial Japanese Navy (IJN) on the United States of America (US) military base at Pearl Harbor and other installations on the island of Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, on December 7, 1941. The Ewa Plain Battlefield boundary covers approximately 180 acres and includes portions of Ewa Field with physical features and characteristics dating to 1941. This includes the airfield, runways, swimming pool, foundations, open fields, and transportation arteries present during the attack.
